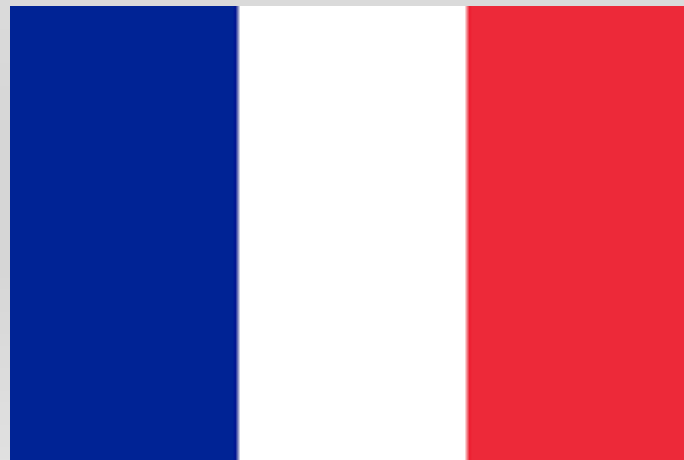

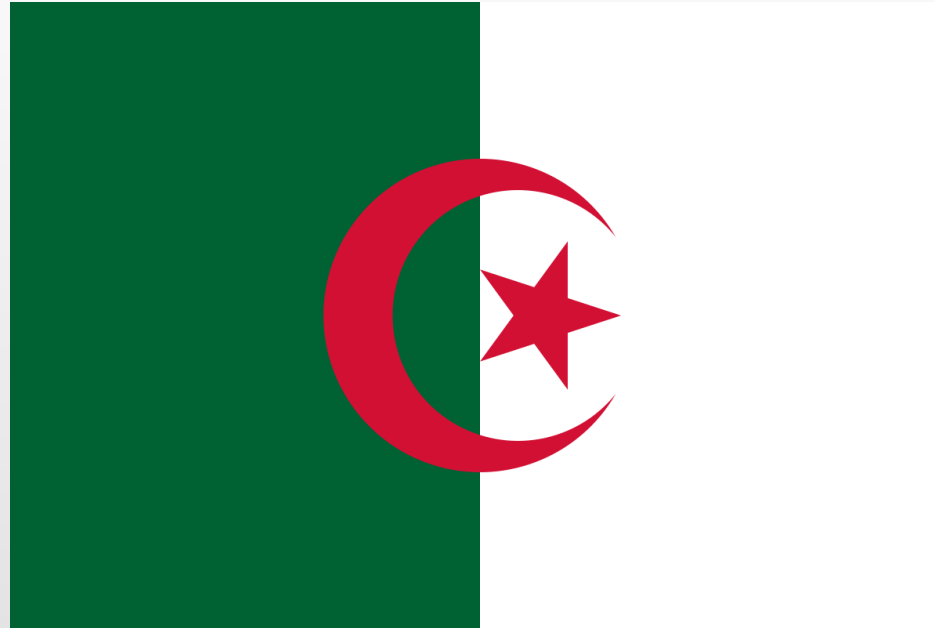
THE 70'S
